

# Using --auth with Sauce Connect Proxy

This approach to authentication works by configuring [Sauce Connect](#) to send authentication details to any URL requesting them. It works for all requests, even those where you're asked for credentials in response to a click or form submission. For each url you need to bypass http authentication for, add this to your Sauce Connect start up command:

```
--auth host:port:username:password
```

If your site doesn't need a port, use the default port, 80.

For example, if the website you want to test is `mysite.com`, your username is `awesometester`, and your password is `supersekrit`, you would add this to your Sauce Connect startup command:

```
--auth mysite.com:80:awesometester:supersekrit
```

You can use this option multiple times in a row.
